

# Nevada Day Notes

## Recommended Equipment:

### 1) Handheld Radio

Regular headphones or headset is recommended as the parade route will be noisy (P.A. system, music from the floats, bands, etc.).

### 2) Spare batteries.

### 3) Note pad/clip board/pen/pencil.

### 4) Weather appropriate clothing

### 5) There will be radio operators at the local emergency operation center. If something happens that requires assistance contact them.

### 6) Water & snacks. The parade typically lasts at least 4 hours and can run much longer.

### 7) Introduce yourself to the parade announcers. There should be 3 chairs on the platform. One is for the radio operator

## Operation:

### 1) One operator rides with the parade director and reports to Net Control.

The reports are missing parade entrants or entrants that are out of order etc.

### 2) Net Control relays the information to the operators at the announcing stands and verifies the receipt of the message.

### 3) The operator at the announcing stands relays the information to the announcers.

### 4) The operator at Heidi's (Williams and Carson) reports to net control when the parade starts and when every 50 entrants pass and when the last entrant passes.

**NOTES: We meet at Reds Old 395 at 6:00 am for breakfast (supplied by the parade) and last-minute notes**

**Parking can be a challenge, some of the operator's park in the Carson mall lot by Reds and others park near their announce positions. This should be done as early as possible because of road closures.**
